Funding Declarations

This week we are sending out letters and forms to parents who have a child that will become entitled to nursery funding in January. The term after children turn three, they are entitled to either 15 funded hours per week or 30- the amount depends on parents working status at the time funding becomes eligible. Funding is available for 38 weeks of the year, but we can spread it across the whole year to make your invoices consistent if parents would prefer. To check your eligibility please go to <https://www.gov.uk/30-hours-free-childcare> If you are entitled to 30 hours you will receive an 11 digit code. We need this code to claim the funding for you. If you are not entitled, then don't panic your child will still receive 15 hours regardless. If your employment status changes then try the check again as you might be entitled to more hours next term. If you have any questions then please do email halesfield@telfordnurseries.org we will be able to help you, guide you through the process and check if we have extra days/sessions available. Once this is set up it is easy to maintain the code and funding. All declaration forms need completing and returning by 11 December to secure funding for next term.
