This week staff and children will commence with our new Sing and Sign programme. We are very excited about this and look forward to learning more sign language and how we can use signing to develop children's speech and language. Drop off and collection procedures

Before COVID, parents were able to access the nursery at any point via the front door using a fingerprint code. This did work well and meant that staff didn't have to keep getting up for the door so children's learning wasn't interrupted often. We are now considering this again so it would be very useful to us to find out parents views.

We know some parents find it easier dropping off at the gate as quicker and children tend to be less clingy, others want to come in and have a chat and pop their child's things on their peg. It may well be that we start internal collection and drop off with the babies initially and build up to the other rooms.
