Sing and Sign

So, we had a lovely first week working with Rachel from Sing and Sign. The children were able to watch pre-recorded videos through the week to learn new signs and songs. The children were fantastic and were able to get the hang of the new signs so quickly- we were very impressed. We will continue watching the weekly sessions and embedding the signs into our daily practice, so the children become fluent and use the signs to communicate. We will try and pop some videos on our new App to share the signs we have learnt so you can use them at home to.

Ann came out to meet us to discuss the scheme and how we could become involved. Safe Places has been set up to help support people who become vulnerable whilst they are out and about. We are now a registered setting, so those signed up to the scheme can come to us if they need help whilst out and about locally. This is just another way the nursery works with and supports our local community.


make sure your child has spare clothes to change into and extra layers to wear at forest school if you can please. It is always much cooler in the woods due to the shade and gusts of wind.
