### **Madeley Matters**

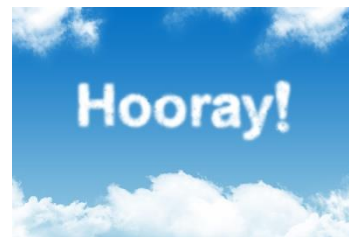
